

## A Journey Through Spanish Art

Over the past academic year, our Key Stage 2 pupils have explored the rich artistic heritage of Spain and Mexico through an inspiring whole-school art project. Each year group studied the life, culture and artistic style of a different Spanish-speaking artist before creating their own unique masterpieces.

**Year 3** discovered the pioneering work of **Pablo Picasso**, exploring Cubism and experimenting with shape, perspective and portraiture.



**Year 4** investigated the colourful and imaginative creations of **Joan Miró**, producing vibrant abstract artwork inspired by his distinctive use of symbols and colour.



**Year 5** explored the fascinating world of **Salvador Dalí**, learning about Surrealism and expressing their creativity through imaginative, dream-like compositions.



**Year 6** celebrated the life and work of **Frida Kahlo**, discovering how art can communicate identity, resilience and culture while creating meaningful self-portraits inspired by her style.



Throughout the project, pupils developed their artistic knowledge and skills while deepening their understanding of the diversity, history and cultural richness of Spain and the wider Spanish-speaking world. By exploring the work of internationally renowned artists, they recognised how creativity can build connections across cultures and inspire new ways of seeing the world.
