

The Life Cycle

When you plant a seed, does it stay a seed forever? No! Plants and animals grow and change throughout their lives.

Many plants begin as seeds. As the seed gets what it needs (water, sunlight, and nutrients from the soil), it begins to grow. The seed turns into a little sprout. It keeps growing until it is a full-grown plant. Then the plant makes new seeds, so that new plants can grow even after the plant grows old and dies. Those seeds will then go through their growth process. Because seeds go through this process over and over again, it is called a life cycle.

Animals also have life cycles. A frog begins as an egg. When the egg hatches, it turns into a tadpole. The tadpoles grow legs and arms, and eventually grow into adult frogs. The adult frogs lay eggs, so that new frogs can live even after the frog grows old and dies.

"Then I'll huff and I'll puff and I'll blow your house down!" growled the big bad wolf. He blew the house down! The two little pigs ran to the third house.


The big bad wolf came to the third house. "Little pig, little pig, let me come in," he snarled.

Sunday 2nd September 1666

The Arctic Fox

Home

The Arctic fox lives in the far north of Canada. For most of the year, this land is covered with snow and ice. The Arctic fox lives in underground dens, digging tunnels through the snow to get from one den to another.

Appearance

In winter, the Arctic fox has thick white fur that keeps it warm. Its coat makes it hard for enemies to see it in the snow. The Arctic fox has fur on its footpads, which protects it from the cold when hunting. The tail of the Arctic fox is bushy, almost like a squirrel's tail. It helps protect the fox from the cold.

In spring, the fox's coat turns brown. Its dark fur makes it hard for enemies to see the fox when it is hunting on the rocky ground. The Arctic fox is the only animal from the dog family to change colour.

Food

The Arctic fox hunts for small animals, such as mice, that it can hear under the snow. It will eat any kind of meat, including birds and fish. If the Arctic fox cannot catch food, it will eat birds' eggs, berries or leftover food caught by other animals such as wolves or polar bears. Sometimes, the Arctic fox will even eat its own droppings!

Sylvia Earle


Sylvia Earle is an American underwater photographer. She was born 30th August 1935.
