- How you pay attention to your teacher
- Knowing what you are doing because you have been listening to the teacher

What is good learning behaviour? What will it look like?

Pupils will be

- Looking smart for school eg wearing school uniform correctly
- Getting to lessons on time to be ready for their learning
- Sitting up with their backs straight
- Walking around the school in silence and sensibly
- Using indoor classroom voices

- Having eye contact with the teacher when they are talking
- Putting up their hand when the teacher is teaching, if they don't understand the work.
- Listening to each other with respect
- Waiting for their turn to speak
- Following instructions

- Looking after the resources
- Using class resources to help them learn
- Using their manners when they receive resources from others.
- Making sure stationery is ready for the next lesson
- Treating equipment with respect

- Writing the LO and date in their books in 60 seconds
- Participating in group work
- Talking about their work
- Working independently
- Talking to peers about the work who they don't usually speak to
- Looking after each other
